Overview

The International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, is the largest global development institution focused exclusively on the private sector in developing countries.

Achievements and progress

- Forward-looking and disaggregated budgets at the organisation level as well as activity-level budgets are available.

Challenges and room for improvement

- The IFC's performance on the Index has not significantly changed in three years.
- The IFC does not publish in the IATI Standard.
- At the activity level, collaboration type, flow type, tied aid status, MoUs, budget documents, contracts, disbursements and expenditure and budget identifiers are not published at all.
- Of the twenty-two indicators that are scored graduated on the basis of format, only eight are published in a machine-readable format.

Recommendations

- The IFC should begin implementation in the IATI Standard, starting with at least a complete organisation file.
- It should consistently publish more activity level information. This data should then be published to the IATI Registry.
- The IFC should join the IATI working group for development finance institutions to learn from others. The IFC should also look to the IDA for lessons to publish more data and provide a full picture of the World Bank Group development activities.
